If you answered yes to one or both of these questions, we encourage you to reach out to us as early as possible in your Program.

1. Register with the Centre for Accessibility

Submit our <u>Information Form</u> **ASAP** so that we will be able to review your request for an intake appointment. A member of our team will review your request to determine if you meet our eligibility criteria within 24-48 hours (business days).

Note: Some accommodations take time to implement, so please contact us as early as possible.

If you have already registered with our office, do <u>not</u> re-submit the form.
